A commentary on our Diocesan Mission Statement

In red, for the blood of Christ: Encountering Christ.

A relationship begins with an encounter. *Jesus told Nicodemus that when he must be raised up* (Jn 3:13), later in the same gospel adding that, *He will thus draw all people to himself* (Jn 12:32)

And so the centurion on Calvary is the first to have the door opened to faith in the crucified Christ: *Surely this man is God's son!* (Mk 15:39) And beholding the wounds in the risen Lord, Thomas exclaims, *My Lord and my God* (Jn 20:28). We meet Christ in many ways (e.g. the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy) but ultimately in his love unto death.



In blue, for the Blessed Virgin Mary: Becoming Disciples.

We learn to follow our Lord by the mentorship of others. The Saints, especially the Blessed Virgin Mary in her 'yes', *Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord*, (Lk 1:38) are our examples and the intercessions. The Lord welcomes us to his family as we grow in the living out of faith in love: *Whoever does the will of my Father is my brother, and sister, and mother* (Mk 3:35)

In green, for springtime health: Making Disciples

Like any healthy organism, we give as we have received, following our Lord's command, *Go, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey all that I have commanded you. And know that I am with you always to the end of the age (Mt 28:20). Thus we dare to be with others in ways that they encounter Christ through us, i.e., through what we do and say.*



Cross in Gold, from (Ps119:79) we hear that in God we have something that is worth more than silver or gold. Indeed, with Saint Paul, we remember that our true boast is in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ (Gal 6:14).
